

Ecclesiastical Establishment: Chapel Royal

Dean 1660-1837

The dean of the chapel royal was appointed by royal warrant. According to *The Present State of the British Court* 'He hath the Government of the King's Chapel, and the choosing of all the officers thereof.' He was also particularly charged with planning services. He received board wages of £200. There is evidence that he was able to augment this sum through the eighteenth century by selling places in the vestry.¹

Sub Dean 1660-1837

The sub dean was appointed by the dean of the chapel royal. He was responsible for the day to day operation of the chapel and, in particular, for overseeing its musical establishment:

To the Sub-dean it belongeth to supply the absence of the Dean, and to be as frequently at the Chapel as he can: to take care that everything therein be conducted with decency and regularity; More especially upon Sundays and Holy Days, when it is the Duty of his Office to go up to the Altar, and to read the

Second Service. On certain days the Subdean goes into the Desk, and Reads the whole service, Viz: Upon Christmas Day, Easter Day, WhitSunday, Ash Wednesday, Good Friday; and on all other days appointed, as days of Thanksgiving, and Fasting. The Subdean Swears and admits all persons into their Places and Offices, by Virtue of a warrant from the Dean, To him directed for that purpose....¹

His remuneration consisted of £11 8s 2d in wages and £79 16s 11d in board wages, plus riding wages. Originally provided with a house, he was awarded £30 in lieu thereof in 1794. This rose to £60 in 1819.

Lord Almoner 1660-1837

The office of lord almoner was in the gift of the Crown, apparently awarded in the first instance by verbal command. Eventually, the almoner received letters patent under the great seal granting him the deodands and other revenues for distribution to the poor. In the absence of a prior indication, appointments have been dated by reference to the letters patent.¹

According to *The Present State of the British Court* 'The Lord Almoner disposes of the King's Alms, and to that End receives, besides other Money allow'd by the King, all Deodand, and all Goods of *Felo de se* to be appropriated to that End.' He was (and remains) particularly associated with the royal Maundy service. He received a salary of £200 in 1720.²

The sub almoner was appointed by warrant of the lord almoner. His remuneration was established at £6 6s 8d in wages and £91 5s in per annum.¹

Clerk of the Closet 1660-1808; c. 1813-1837

The clerk of the closet was appointed by royal warrant and served under the authority of the lord chamberlain.¹ His duty was ‘to attend at the King’s Right Hand during Divine Service, to resolve such Doubts as may arise in spiritual Matters; but chiefly to wait on his Majesty in his private Oratory or Closet, and to say Grace when his Majesty eats.’² During the reign of Anne the office was held jointly by three individuals. It was vacant from the death of Richard Hurd, 28 May 1808, until possibly as late as 1813. The salary was variously expressed as 20 nobles, £6 13s 4d and £6 18s. The clerk of the closet was also allowed diet and fees of honour.³

Clerk of the Closet to the Queen [?1689]-1694

The clerk of the closet to the Queen was paid £6 13s 4d per annum.¹

The deputy clerks of the closet were appointed by the clerk of the closet and waited in his absence. They received no salary on the household establishment.¹ There were two such deputy clerks waiting in rotation by 1716; the number rose to three by 1723.

Closet Keeper [in the Chapel Royal] 1661-1837

The closet keeper was appointed by the clerk of the closet.¹ He was paid 2s p.d. in 1661. This rose to £5 plus £49 in and £54 5s for washing surpluses and in lieu of bills in 1689. Under

Queen Anne, his remuneration fell to £41 10s in salary and £49 2s for washing. By 1716 he was receiving an additional £31 5s for providing table-linen for the chaplains. He was also allowed diet, riding wages and fees of honour.²

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Chaplains 1660-1837

The chaplains were appointed by lord chamberlain's warrant. Prior to 1702, large numbers of chaplains in ordinary and extraordinary were appointed. From the former were drawn the forty-eight chaplains actually in waiting, four being assigned to each month of the year, each to wait for one week.¹ After 1702 only the 48 active chaplains in waiting (still officially designated as 'in Ordinary') were appointed. In 1720, their duties were as follows:

They are to preach in the Royal Chapel on Sundays, and other Festivals; and in the Morning before the Household: To read Divine Service before the King, out of Chapel, twice a Day in the private Oratory; and to say Grace to the King at Dinner, in the Absence of the Clerk of the Closet).²

Originally, the chaplains in waiting received board wages of 12s. a day. In 1665 they were granted diet instead. According to *The Present State of the British Court*, their lack of a salary 'besides the Honour of the Employment, is abundantly made up to them, by being constantly in the King's Eye, for Spiritual Preferment, and being esteem'd to merit from Him by this their

Attendance at Court.³ In 1805 their table was commuted to an allowance of £30 a year.⁴

Gentlemen 1660-1837

The gentlemen of the chapel royal were appointed by the dean of the chapel via warrant to the sub dean. In the Later-Stuart period there were 32 gentlemen of the chapel royal, twelve of whom were priests and twenty plain gentlemen or lay clerks.¹ There was much fluctuation at the end of the seventeenth century, but the official establishment was reduced to ten priests and sixteen lay clerks at the accession of George II in 1727.² By that time thirteen gentlemen waited every month, divided into five priests and eight lay clerks. The senior gentleman or father of the chapel was excused from attendance.³

At the beginning of the period the gentlemen of the chapel royal received the same salary as they had under the early Stuarts: £40 per annum. This was raised to £70 in 1662. After 1689, their pay was settled at £11 8s 2d in wages, £61 11s 10d in or a total of £73. In addition, they received £2 per annum apiece in New Years gifts and riding wages.⁴

According to Chamberlayne, the confessor to the household ‘is to Read Prayers every Morning to the Family, to visit the Sick, to examine Communicants, to inform such as desire advice in any Case of Conscience or Point of Religion, &c.’⁵ In the mid-eighteenth century he came to be referred to as the household chaplain and this became his official title from 1833.⁶ He received an additional £10 in wages plus £26 10s ‘for himself and to provide Surplices and Washing at 2s. p Day.’⁷

The clerk of the cheque was elected by the gentlemen of the chapel from among their number

until 1720. Thereafter he was always the sergeant of the vestry and was, therefore, chosen by the dean. This officer was responsible for keeping the chapel cheque books, marking attendance and collecting fines from absentees. He received an additional 2d in the pound from each salaried gentleman from 1663.⁸

Composers 1699-1837

The position of composer of the chapel royal was created in 1699 for John Blow. Prior to this date, no chapel royal servant was specifically charged with composing new music; such music came either from members of the choir or the organists or from outsiders such as Matthew Locke.¹

The composers of the chapel royal were generally appointed by the dean via warrant to the sub dean. From 1707 there were two composers (one such place being held jointly 1707-1708). Blow was paid £73 per annum as composer, divided into £11 8s 1 1/2d wages and £61 11s 10 1/2d in board wages.² The same fees were applied to the two composers in ordinary from 1707. Handel's fee as 'Composer of Musick for the Chappel royal' was £200 paid at the treasurer of the chamber's office.³ By the 1780s each composer/organist was paid £146 (*i.e.*, £73 per place) per annum.⁴

Organists 1660-1837

The organists were appointed by the dean of the chapel and sworn in by the sub dean. There were three organists from 1660 to 1674, four from 1674 to 1687, three again from 1687 to 1697 (one position being Extraordinary 1695 to 1697); and two thereafter (one such position being held jointly from 1704 to 1707). Francis Pigot received £100 in 1700. In 1704, the organists are listed at £73 per annum apiece, divided into wages of £11 8 s 1 1/2d and of £61 11s 10 1/2d.¹ By the early-nineteenth century Sir George Smart was established at £58 per annum.

The organ blower, organ maker and tuner of the regals were appointed by the lord chamberlain via warrants to the gentlemen ushers, daily waiters. The organ blower made £10 on the Establishment of 1689, raised to £20 on that of 1702.¹ The organ maker received 20d per diem in 1660 but is listed as unsalaried in 1720.² The tuner of the regals, etc., made £56 per annum for keeping the organs in repair in 1702.³

Master of the Children 1660-1837

The master of the children was appointed by lord chamberlain's warrant.¹ According to William Lovegrove,

The Master of the Children hath generally (tho' not always) been chosen out of the Organists or Gentlemen of the Chapel....The Master's Duty is to teach [the Children of the Chapel] to sing, play upon the Harpsichord or Organ, Writing Arithmetick, and compose.²

This officer was paid £15 4s 2d at the Restoration, raised in 1661 to £30 plus £200 for outfitting the choristers. By May 1667 the master was paid a total of £700 per annum for winter and summer liveries.³ Pelham Humfrey was paid £40 in salary for life; this rose to £80 in 1710. In 1704 Blow was paid an additional £240 (*i.e.*, £24 per pupil) for outfitting the boys.⁴ Beginning in August 1715 the master was also paid £40 'for finding Masters to teach them to Read, Write, and cast Accounts' and £40 'for teaching them to compose, Play on the Organ and harpsichord'.⁵ Under George III, total remuneration, including the outfitting of the boys, came to £361 10s.⁶

Children 1660-?

Children of the chapel royal were appointed by the master of the children, often after having been requisitioned from leading cathedral choirs. They were taught, clothed, fed and boarded by

the master who received an allowance from the Crown for this purpose. There were twelve such children at the beginning of the period, but their number was reduced to ten by 1720.¹ Upon the breaking of his voice, each chorister was dismissed with ‘the usual Allowance of One Suit of plain Cloth one hatt and band two holland Shirts two Cravatts two pair of Cuffs two handkerchiefs two pair of Stockings two pair of Shoes and two pair of Gloves’ plus a cash payment of £20. By the late eighteenth century the suit was commuted into an additional payment of £20.²

The Vestry 1660-1837

The offices of the vestry, sometimes referred to as the sergeant, yeomen and groom of the chapel, were in the gift of the dean of the chapel royal. Appointments were made by his warrant to the sub dean.¹ There were two yeomen of the vestry from 1660 to 1686. From 1720 the

sergeant also served as clerk of the cheque.

According to the dean's order of 28 May 1728, the sergeant's duty included opening the door of the vestry during hours of prayer, setting out the candlesticks and books on the lesson desk, walking with his verge before the dean, the bishops and sub dean to their seats, keeping the altar clean 'and in decent order,' providing bread and wine for services, new books, surplices, and furniture for the use of the chapel, and washing the surplices. The yeoman was 'to open the Pew Seats within the Chapel at the Hours of Prayer,' to place the forms and hassocks within the chapel, to arrange the prayer books and provide and arrange the wax candles in the main body of the chapel and 'to keep out of the Chapel, Persons and things not fit to be there.' In this he was assisted by the groom, whose first duty was 'to take care of all Publick Doors...To take care that the Chapel be not crowded by letting too many persons into it, so as to hinder the passage to the Communion-Table.' The groom was also responsible for cleaning the chapel, providing candles for the ante-chapel and gentlemen's vestry and assisting the gentlemen with their surplices.²

In 1685 the sergeant of the vestry was established at £54 15s; the two yeomen at £41 10s each and the groom at £36 10s. In 1689 the sergeant was raised to £6 16s 10 1/2d in wages, £66 3s 1 1/2d in board wages; the yeoman to £5 wages, £49 15s in board wages; and the groom to £5 and £43 12s 6d.³ In addition, the sergeant made £120 per annum for the provision of books, surplices, etc.⁴ From 1702, this was reduced to £60 'for washing Surplices for Strewings, and all Other Necessaries in lieu of Bills' but from 1714 he was also paid an additional £49 2 for providing similar items at Whitehall.⁵ The grooms were raised to £51 12s 6d in 1703.⁶ Throughout the period, the groom took vails from those who wished to be seated in chapel.⁷

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Roman Catholic Chapel Royal 1686-1688

The Catholic chapel royal opened at Christmas 1686.¹ According to the Establishment of 5 July 1687, the master of the musicians made £200 per annum, the master of the gregorians, £50. Other musicians were paid at various rates: two at £100, three at £60, seventeen (including nine gregorians) at £50 and three (including one gregorian) at £40, all paid on the cofferer's account, beginning at Lady Day 1687.² The superceding Establishment of 20 Mar. 1688 provided, in

addition to the two masters as above, four musicians (including an organist) at £100, two at £80, two at £60, nine gregorians and twelve instrumentalists, all at £50 per annum apiece. The musicians could also make between £15 and £20 in fees for distributing music, tuning the harpsichord, etc. Finally, there was an additional unnamed servant to blow the organ at £20.³

An additional 28 non-musical places, their holders unnamed, appear on the Establishment of 26 Apr. 1687, to begin payment at Christmas 1686.⁴ This was superceded by the Establishment of 20 Mar. 1688, which provides the names listed below for that date.⁵ According to this Establishment, the six preachers made £60 per annum apiece, two sacristans, two vergers and the porter, £50 apiece; four unnamed chaplains, £57 10s apiece while an additional chaplain made £30; the seamstress, £40 plus £20 for extraordinary washing; the necessary women and cushion men, £20 apiece.

Chapel Royal at St. James's (from 1704, Whitehall) 1689-1829; 1837

The chapel royal at St. James's was established in 1689. By January 1704, in the aftermath of the burning of Whitehall, it was removed to the Banqueting House of that palace.¹ Its officers were appointed by warrant from the dean of the chapel royal to the sub-dean. There were two reading chaplains attached to the chapel 'whose duty is to read Prayers twice a day in their respective waitings, on Sundays more particularly at Eight of the Clock in the morning, when the Sacrament is always administred throughout the whole Year; and after it at Ten of the Clock' at £10 in wages and £70 in board wages per annum apiece.² In addition, there were six preaching chaplains, appointed by the dean of the chapel royal, in attendance for two months at a time between at least 1692 and 1724. Early editions of Chamberlayne list a salary of £80 per annum, apiece, but by the reign of George I they received no salary.³ Late in the reign of William III these six chaplains were designated 'The Princess's Chaplains'.⁴

From 1724 the six preaching chaplains were increased to twenty-four, 'being Fellows of Colleges in the two Universities' at £30 per annum apiece 'for preaching one Month in the Year.'⁵ These positions ceased in 1829 when the Whitehall chapel was closed for renovations. When it was reopened in April 1837 it was staffed by just two preachers.⁶

The closet keeper at St. James's, transferred to Whitehall about 1704, made £50 per annum plus £40 as chapel keeper. The chapel keeper at St. James's (later Whitehall), sometimes called the yeoman of the chapel (and therefore not to be confused with the yeoman of the vestry: see *RK* [1797], p. 94), was paid £50 plus £50 per annum for providing surplices. Under George I, his wages were reduced to £41 10s but he made an additional £31 5s by providing table-linen for the chaplains. This was in addition to the £50 for surplices.⁷

Foreign Chapels c. 1714-1837

The Lutheran or German chapel was originally established as part of the household of Prince George of Denmark.¹ It became part of the royal establishment after the accession of George I. This reign also saw the establishment of the Dutch and French chapels at St. James's. All three came under the jurisdiction of the dean of the chapel royal and their offices were in his gift. Officials were appointed by dean's warrant to the sub-dean.²

The two chaplains of the Lutheran chapel (raised to three c. 1716-1718) made £200 per annum; the reader of common prayer in German, £40; the chapel keeper, £60; the porter, £20; the necessary woman, £16; the three French preaching ministers and two Dutch preaching ministers made £160; the Dutch reader made £30 per annum, the French reader, £40; the sexton and porter of the Dutch and French chapels, £15. From March 1717 the French preachers received an additional £8 12s, the Dutch preachers £20 12s, for the provision of bread, wine, candles, etc. for communion services. In 1727 this arrangement was reversed because the French preachers now gave the evening service and had, therefore, greater need of candles. The 1727 establishment also reduced the preachers of the Dutch chapel to £100 apiece and the Dutch reader to £30 (However, Lovegrove MSS, p. 28, Est. 1727 gives £160 per annum apiece.) The following year the French reader's salary rose to £100 per annum. By 1748 the first preacher of the Lutheran chapel made £275, the second preacher £240, the reader £62, the chapel keeper £50. The second preacher of the Lutheran or German chapel was abolished c. 1820. By 1836, the keeper of the Lutheran chapel was also its clerk and organist at £10 per annum.³
