DEPARTMENT OF THE MASTER OF THE HORSE or Stables

Master of the Horse 1660-1837

The Master of the Horse is esteem'd the third great Officer at Court, giving Precedence only to the Lord Steward, and Lord Chamberlain of the Household. To him is committed the Charge of ordering and disposing of all Matters relating to the King's Stables, Races, Breed of Horses, as he had anciently of all the Posts in England. He hath the Power of commanding the Equerries, and all other Officers and Tradesmen employ'd in the King's Stables; to all which he gives by his warrant to the Avener, the Oath of Allegiance, &c. for the true and faithful Discharge of their Duty. He has the Charge of the Revenues appointed for the Service and Maintenance of the King's Horses, for the Expence of the Stables, for Coaches, Litters, Sumpter Horses, &c. He has also the Privilege, which no other Servant of the Crown hath, of making use of any Horses, Pages, or Footmen, belonging to the King's Stables; so that his Coaches, Horses, and Attendants, are the King's, and have the King's Arms and Liveries. At any solemn Cavalcade he has the Honour to ride next behind the King, and leads the Horse of State. ¹

The master of the horse was appointed by the Crown which issued a warrant to the lord steward directing the swearing of the individual concerned. Appointments were customarily embodied in letters patent under the great seal granting the office during pleasure except in the case of the Duke of Buckingham who received a grant for life in 1668. During the vacancies of the office in 1679-82 and 1702 commissioners for the stables were appointed. In the case of the Duke of Richmond, appointed in 1682, it was provided that he should not execute the office in person until he reached the age of fourteen, the duties in the meantime being undertaken by three commissioners. The office was executed by two commissioners 1712-14 and 1715-17 and by one commissioner 1717-27.

The wages of the master of the horse, originally amounting to £1,460, were reduced to £500 in 1679 but raised to £1,200 in 1685.² In 1702 the remuneration consisted of wages of £66 13s 4d (representing the old patent salary of 100 marks) and board wages of £1,200 making a total of £1,266 13s 4d. In addition, he was entitled to lodgings, plate worth £400 and, at the death of the Sovereign, his pick of the royal horses.³ In 1812 the salary was fixed at £3,350.⁴ The commissioners who served between 1715 and 1727 received salaries of £800 each, plus lodgings.⁵

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Gentleman of the Horse

c. 1693-1782; 1828-37

According to *The Present State of the British Court*, "the Gentleman of the Horse is always the first Equerry...and is the next immediate Officer under the Master of the Horse, in whose absence he presides in all Affairs relating to the King's Stables.' The gentleman of the horse was appointed by royal warrant. The earliest mention of the office occurs in 1693 when a salary of £256 was attached to it. It was abolished in 1782 but revived in 1828 with a salary of £500.³

Avenor, Chief Equerry and Clerk Martial 1660-1837

The avenor and clerk martial was responsible for swearing in all officers and servants of the Stables by on warrants of the master of the horse. He was also required to make up the Stables accounts and issue debentures for paying its personnel. The office of avenor existed from the Restoration until 1783 when it was abolished and replaced by that of chief, or first equerry. Both these offices were held concurrently with that of clerk martial. The offices were in the gift of the Crown. Appointments were made by royal warrant to the lord steward requiring him to admit the recipient.¹

After some variations the salary of the avenor and clerk martial was fixed at £260 in 1685.² On the creation of the office of chief equerry in 1783 its occupant received a salary of £500 in respect of that office and £60 as clerk martial.³ In 1812 the salary of the combined offices was fixed at £528 together with an allowance of £250 for house rent making a total of £778.⁴ In 1823 the remuneration was fixed at £1,000.⁵

Equerries 1660-1837

The chief duty of the equerries was "to attend the King on Horseback, and on all public Occasions'. In fact, by the reign of George I, they rode in the lead coach. In addition, equerries of the crown stable were 'to superintend the Saddle and Manage Stables;...and to instruct the Pages of Honor in Horsemanship'.¹ The equerries were appointed by royal warrant. During the reign of Charles II their number was fixed in principle at twelve, eight of whom were designated equerries of the hunting stable and four equerries of the crown, great or courser's stable.² During

the reign of James II their number was reduced to six, with no distinction made as to function. The distinction returned under William III, when one was designated of the crown stable (*see* below). In 1760 the number of regular equerries rose to eight. It was reduced to seven in 1767.³ In 1783 the office of chief, or first, equerry was created and united to that of clerk martial. At the same time the number of ordinary equerries was fixed at four.⁴ From 1799 one or two extra equerries served.

In 1664 the remuneration attached to the offices consisted of wages of £20 and board wages of £100 plus diet at the gentlemen waiters' table.⁵ In 1685 the salary was £256.⁶ In 1704 it was increased to £300.⁷ In 1803 it was raised to £445 while in 1812 it was fixed at £322 with an allowance of £250 in lieu of a house. In 1813 the salary was raised to £500 bringing the total remuneration to £750.⁸

After 1690 there was one equerry of the crown stable. From 1715 two served each with a salary of £256.9 In 1765 they were differentiated in rank and designated first and second equerry, with salaries of £256 and £200 respectively. In 1779 the office of first equerry was abolished. The salary of the remaining equerry was increased to £322 in 1812 and to £445 in 1823. Extra equerries of the crown stable were appointed from time to time.

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Pages of Honour 1660-1837

The pages of honour were to attend the monarch on all public occasions. They were appointed by royal warrant.¹ The number of pages fluctuated considerably. In 1669 it was fixed at three. It rose to four in 1682, fell to two in 1685 and again rose to four in 1689.² A fifth page served for a brief period after the accession of George III in 1760 and between 1773 and 1783. In the latter year the number was again fixed at four.³ The salary was £156 in 1668, £260 in 1727 (divided from 1779 into £230 salary and £30 for instruction in horsemanship), plus diet when in waiting.⁴ Extra pages were occasionally appointed.

Governor to the Pages of Honour 1703-1782

The governor to the pages of honour was appointed by the Crown. His official remuneration consisted of £100 per annum and diet when in attendance. After 1727, he was paid out of the Pensions Office. The place was filled until 1782.¹

Clerks of the Stables c. 1669-1837

The clerk of the stables was the principal clerical officer of the Stables. His duties were described in 1782 as follows:

To transact all the official Business of this Department with the Master of the Horse; to superintend and direct the Servants and the Business of the Stables under him; to execute all Orders relative to the same; and to controll and pay the Tradesmen's Bills, small Salaries and to keep the Accounts thereof, and Pensions.

From 1782 he paid all salaries, bills and creditors that had been paid at the cofferer's office. The clerk of the stables was appointed by royal warrant. Although the office formed part of the establishment from the Restoration its occupants can be identified only from 1669. By 1772 the clerk had come to be known as the principal clerk of the stables to distinguish him from the

assistant or under clerk. On the suppression of the latter post in 1782 the former was redesignated clerk of the stables.² In 1830 the office was combined with that of secretary to the master of the horse.³

In 1664 the salary of the office was £16 14s 7d. In 1685 it was raised to £224. In 1783 the remuneration, having previously consisted of a salary of £250 and an allowance of £83 5s, was fixed at £350. In 1812 the salary was £700 rising to £800 by 1820. It fell to £750 in 1823 and to £400 in 1828. In 1830 it was fixed at £700.⁴

The assistant or under clerk of the stables was appointed by warrant of the master of the horse. Prior to 1772 he had been a non-established servant, paid out of an allowance to the clerk of the stables. From 1772 he received a salary of £100 plus an allowance of £25. The office was abolished in 1782.⁵

The second clerk of the stables was appointed by warrant of the master of the horse. In 1812 he made £300 in salary. By 1830 he was also allowed £80 for a horse.⁶

An assistant clerk was granted £100 in 1821 and raised to £200 in 1826. In 1827 he was given responsibility for the stables at Windsor. The post was eliminated in the following year, only to be revived at the accession of William IV at £200 per annum.⁷

Clerks of the Avery c. 1661-1782

The clerks of the avery collected bills and prepared the stable creditor for extraordinary expenses. Appointments were made by warrant of master of the horse. There were originally two such clerks who each received wages of £26 13s 4d and board wages of £36 10s amounting in total to £63 3s 4d in 1664, reduced to £40 each in 1679. In 1685 the number of clerks was reduced to one with a salary of £86. In 1702 this was raised to £125. Under George III he received an additional £69 2s for house rent. This had risen to £86 by the time the office was abolished in 1782.

Surveyor of the Highways 1660-1782

The office of surveyor of the highways or guide and conductor to the king

when his Majesty travels, goes before, and takes care that the Roads are in good Order for his Majesty's passing. He has also the Government and Inspection of the Roads, calld [sic] the King's and it is by Passport from him that any Body has free Passage thro' the same.¹

This office was under the authority of the master of the horse and was appointed by his warrant. It is to be distinguished from that of surveyor of the roads which was under the authority of the board of works and to which appointments were made by the Crown by letters patent under the great seal. These posts were, however, held concurrently by the same individual until 1731. The salary of the surveyor of the highways amounted to £82. The office was abolished in 1782.²

Surveyors of the Stables 1660-1727

The surveyors of the stables were appointed by warrant of the master of the horse. At least one such officer was appointed from 1660. Established at four in 1664 with wages of 11d a day (£16 14s 1d a year), the number of surveyors was reduced to three in 1680. There was a further reduction to two in 1685 when the salary was fixed at £120. In 1689-90 three surveyors were appointed with specific responsibilities for the 'Great Mews' in London and for the stables at Hampton Court and Kensington. They were reduced to one in 1702 and increased to two in 1714. The offices were abolished in 1727.

Storekeeper of the Stables 1702-1837

The storekeeper was appointed by the master of the horse. His duties were to maintain and store furnishings for horses and other stores belonging to the Stables. This office first appears on the Establishment of 1702 at £93 per annum. Under Anne this place was held in conjunction with that of yeoman sadler. By 1807, it was granted an additional allowance of £31 per annum. In 1812 its salary was reduced to £81. This establishment also names a storekeeper at Carlton House at £57 per annum. By 1830 this officer also received an allowance of £9 10s. 1

Riding Purveyor 1660-1702; 1714-1782

The riding purveyor (referred to as the 'Yeoman Riding Purveyor' on the Stables Establishment of 1669) was appointed by the master of the horse. His duty was to provide horses, at a daily rate previously agreed upon, when the court was on progress. However, this office had become superfluous and its incumbent inactive by 1782.

This officer was allowed wages of £27 7s 6d and a hackney livery (later the equivalent in money of a nagg's livery) on the Establishments of Charles II. Under James II his wages were raised to £200 per annum. He also received an allowance of 6d per horse per night. The office was not filled under Queen Anne. It was finally abolished in 1782.

Purveyors and Granitors c. 1669-1782

The purveyors and granitors supplied the King's Stables with provisions for horses. They were appointed by warrant of the master of the Horse to the avenor and clerk martial. The Establishment of 1669 provides for six yeomen purveyors and four purveyors and granitors at 2s per diem, plus a hackney livery, apiece (translated on the Est. of 1682 to £27 7s 6d). That of 1682 lists a total of ten purveyors and granitors, with five to determine. The Establishment of 1685 reduced their number to four at £47 per annum, each. A single purveyor and granitor was appointed in 1702 at £120 per annum. This rose to two at £47 in 1714, then four in 1716, before falling again to one at £188 in 1727. Two were named again at £94 apiece from 1733.

By 1782 the provisions for horses were made by contract; it was therefore decided to abolish the salaries of these officers.²

The Carriages 1660-1782

The officers in charge of the carriages were all appointed by the master of the horse (except in 1685, when Robert Gargrave was appointed 'Sergeant Gentleman of the Carriages' by royal warrant). The position of sergeant was eliminated on the Establishment of 1702, but restored on that of 1714. The sergeant of the carriages made £41 10s per annum on the Household Establishment of 1664, £41 on the Establishment of 1679 and £86 from that of 1685. The office had become a sinecure by the time of its abolition in 1782.

There were two 'Yeomen of the Close Carriages' at £13 13s 9d apiece on the Household Establishment of 1664. There were eight yeomen or grooms of the carriages (*i.e.*, of indeterminate position; later called yeomen of the wagons) and a yeoman of the little close cart on the Stables Establishment of 1682. All but two of these places were abolished in 1685. The remaining servants made £18 per annum on the Establishment of 1685. Their number was reduced to one at £36 per annum on that of 1702. In addition, yeomen of the carriages were allowed one hackney or nagg's livery on the Establishments of 1669 and 1682. This position became a sinecure by the time of its abolition in 1782.²

The two grooms of the carriages earned £24 6s 8d per annum on the Household Establishment of 1664, £18 5s on that of 1679. For the subsequent history of these places see yeomen of the carriages.³

Riders c. 1669-1702; 1714-1837

Riders were appointed by the master of the horse. Their duties were to break in and ride the 'manage' horses, attend the King abroad on horseback, and assist in the instruction of pages of honour in horsemanship. In this last capacity they were subordinate to the equerries of the crown stable. There were four yeoman riders of the coursers' stable at £35 per annum apiece, plus one yeoman rider of the hunting stable at £51 14s 2d on the Household Establishment of 1664. There were three yeoman riders of the courser's Stable and two yeoman riders of the hunting stable on that of March 1669. Wages were set at £36 10s per annum plus one horse livery in money. A yeoman rider of the race and running horses served between 1673 and 1682. The original ratio was restored on the Stables Establishment of 1682, with wages varying between £30 for the former and £36 10s for the latter, per annum.¹

The number of yeoman riders was reduced to two but their wages raised to £130 each on the Establishment of 1685. No yeoman riders were appointed under Queen Anne. One such officer was restored, at the same wages as in 1685, in 1714, two from 1716. From 1765, the two yeoman riders' salaries were established at £186 and £130, respectively. In addition, they received allowances of £44 and £20 out of the pages' salaries, plus 5s per diem of attendance on the King. By 1807 these allowances had risen to £85 12s and £29, respectively. By 1817 their salaries had risen to £250 for the first yeoman rider, £150 for the second. By 1830, the former received an additional £80 for a horse, the latter £50.²

There were four child riders on the Stables Establishments of 1669 and 1682.³

Officially, there were two assistant riders 1760-1765, 1770-c. 1778 and 1783-1812, one at other times. An extra assistant rider served 1772-1783. Assistant riders were established at £60 per annum in 1760. Both officers had their salaries reduced to £40 apiece in 1777. By 1807 they were entitled to additional allowances worth £32 for the first assistant, £23 for the second. The position was abolished by the Establishment of 6 April 1812.⁴

Sadlers c. 1662-?1812

The sadlers were appointed by the master of the horse. The esquire sadler's remuneration consisted of one horse livery on the Stables Establishment of 1669. This was commuted to a money payment on that of 1682. He was established at £18 per annum in 1685. The position was combined with that of the groom sadler on the Establishment of 1702, at wages of £76 per annum. These places were split again on the Establishment of 1714, the esquire sadler making £58 per annum. This salary was abolished in 1782 when the post was reduced to purveyor status. The post was finally eliminated on the Establishment of 1812.¹

The yeoman sadler was appointed by the master of the horse. His wages consisted of £13 6s 8d on the Establishment of 1664. His wages rose to £183 per annum in 1685. In 1702 wages declined to £93 per annum despite the addition of the title and duties of storekeeper. Finally, his wages were settled at £36 per annum on the Establishment of 1714. This salary was

discontinued in 1782, the officer becoming a simple purveyor. The post was finally eliminated on the Establishment of 1812.²

There were three groom sadlers by 1662 at wages of £18 5s. Their number fell to two by 1668. The Establishment of 1685 reduced their number to one, but raised his salary to £58 per annum. The position was combined with that of esquire sadler in 1702 and eliminated on the Establishment of 1714.³

Farriers c. 1669-1791

The farriers were appointed by the master of the horse. The sergeant farrier received wages of £19 15s 5d on the Household Establishment of 1664. These wages were raised to £42 per annum in 1685. They were continued at this rate, even while the office was combined with the marshal farrier's position, from c. 1699 to 1707. This figure was raised to £98 in 1718. This salary was discontinued in 1782. The office, along with that of marshal farrier, was abolished and replaced by that of farrier in ordinary on 21 November 1791.

There were two marshal farriers at £18 5s on the Household Establishment of 1664. The Establishment of 1685 lists one marshal farrier at £31 per annum. This office was combined with that of sergeant farrier from c. 1699 to 1707. Its wages were raised to £50 in 1707. This salary was abolished in 1782. The office abolished with the creation of the farrier's position in

There were three yeoman farriers at £16 14s 7d on the Household Establishment of 1664. On the Stables Establishment of 1682 there were two yeoman farriers at £18 5s plus a money payment equivalent to one nagg's livery. The Establishment of 1685 lists one yeoman farrier at £48 per annum. These wages were lowered to £36 10s in 1702, but raised to 50 during the reign of George II. This remuneration was abolished in 1782 when the place became a simple purveyorship. It was finally abolished with the creation of the farrier's position in 1791.³

The Household Establishment of 1664 lists four groom farriers at £18 5s per annum. Their number rose to five on the Stables Establishment of 1682, then declined to three at £28 per annum on that of 1685. The office was eliminated under Anne. There were two groom farriers on the Establishment of 1714 at £28 per annum; the office was discontinued on 1 Apr. 1718.⁴

The Establishment of 1669 lists a coachmaker at 12d per diem and one hackney livery, in 1682 worth £18 5s. In 1685 his emoluments were settled at £36 per annum. From 1713 to 1727 there were two such officers.¹

In 1782 it was reported that since the coachmaker submitted bills and was 'very well paid' for his work, his salary ought to be discontinued. The salaried position was eliminated on 7 Nov. 1782.²

Stable (or Mews) Keepers c. 1669-1837

Stable keepers were appointed by the master of the horse. Though some establishments list but two, there were six stable keepers at various locations in 1669. Two of these positions fail to appear on the Establishment of 1682, but one seems to have been restored on that of 1685. Only three stable keepers are listed in 1689, including a keeper at Theobalds who was appointed under William III only. A keeper of the stables at Kensington was established in 1702; one at St. James's and one at Somerset House, respectively, in 1714; and a stable Keeper at Newmarket in 1724 (for a total of six thereafter). A stable Keeper at Windsor was appointed in 1760. The stable keeper at Somerset House was abolished in 1779; that at St. James's had determined by 1782. In 1827 the position at Windsor was abolished.

Stable keepers made £12 3s on the Household Establishment of 1664, £12 on that of 1685, and £36 per annum from that of 1702. The exceptions were the stable keeper at Windsor who made only £27 6s, and that at Newmarket at £25 per annum. In 1791, the stable keepers at London and Westminster received an additional £6 per annum, that at Newmarket £4. By 1807, the stable keepers also received allowances ranging from £20 to £57 18s 6d. The 1812 Establishment provided £86 for the stable keeper of the King's Mews in London; £81 for that at Hampton Court; £82 at Kensington; £47 10s at Windsor; and £25 at Newmarket.²

Footmen 1660-1837

Footmen (referred to as 'yeoman footmen' on early establishments of Charles II) were appointed by the master of the horse. There were thirteen such positions on the Household Establishment of 1664, twelve on that of 1685 and sixteen from that of 1689. This number rose to eighteen in 1813, then nineteen on the Establishment of 1831.¹

Footmen were paid wages of £13 6s 8d per annum under Charles II. This rose to £53 per annum under James II. They were also allowed a suit of livery worth £38, diet when in attendance and they collected, on average, about £2 per annum in fees of honour. In 1727 the first footman made £106 per annum. In 1807 they were estimated to make about £5 per annum in tips from nobility attending court functions. Additionally, from 1766 they divided an annual award of 100 guineas for extraordinaries on progresses and removes; this was raised to £240 in 1792. In 1812 six footmen received £105 in salary each, the remainder £95. From 1814 the first footman received an additional 12 guineas per annum. By 1820 the footmen were established at £132 12s for the first footman (later the sergeant footman), £120 for five, and £110 for the remaining twelve.²

Coachmen 1660-1837

Coachmen (referred to as groom coachmen on the Establishments of Charles II) were appointed by the master of the horse. There were five coachmen on the Household Establishment of 1664. They were allowed £39 10s 10d in wages, out of which they were to pay their postillions as well. This figure rose to £73 by the Establishment of 1679. James II cut the number of coachmen at these wages to four, with an additional officer at £18 per annum. William III raised the number at £73 to 6, allowing them a suit of livery worth £48. Anne lowered these wages to £65 per annum. Coachmen also earned an average of about £1 in fees of honour annually. George II employed five to six coachmen, with one of these receiving a little over a double salary (*i.e.*, £138 per annum). A seventh coachman served intermittently under George III. In 1807 the salary was £65, with additional allowances of £70 to £90 apiece. Seven served in 1812 at £150 apiece and an extra coachman served 1818-1823 and from 1831. By the latter year, many coachmen had allowances for goods in kind ranging between £6 6s and £15 16s.

From 1758 a separate body coachman (also known as the state coachman) at £10 per annum was appointed. In 1783 he made £83 in salary and allowances. This rose to £191 by 1807, £200 in 1812.

Postillions in the Stables [?1660]-?; c. 1705-1837

Postillions were appointed by the master of the horse. Two were established in 1660, but there is a long gap in the records thereafter. Queen Anne's Establishment lists six such officers at £30 in wages, plus £28 per annum in livery. This number was reduced to five on that of George II. This Establishment divides the office's remuneration into £25 in wages and £5 in livery money. Postillions were also allowed a suit of livery worth £28. George III was served by seven postillions until 1791; then six (at £35 in salary) until 1801, when a seventh was once again appointed. In 1812 the body postillion (also known as the state postillion) made £95 in salary, the remaining servants £85. All but the body postillion's position were eliminated on the Establishment of 1830, upon which his salary rose to £100.1

The postchaiseman was allowed £40 (£35 in salary, £5 for linen) per annum from 1761, £46 10s from 1791, £98 1s 6d in 1807 and £95 from 1812. This rose to £100 in 1830.²

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Helpers in the Stables c. 1704-1837

The helpers in the Stables were appointed by the master of the horse. These officers first appear on the Establishment of 1702, which lists six at £30 per annum. Their number was reduced to three on that of 1727, which divides their remuneration into £25 in wages and £5 in livery money. Their number rose to five by 1760. Seven served in the first years of George III; an ?eighth was added in 1766. A total of seven served by 1782. Under George III a distinction began to be drawn between 'Established Helpers' (listed below simply as 'helpers') and 'byehelpers', whose employment seems to have been more ad-hoc. In 1791 there were six established helpers at £35 apiece. An additional helper was established in 1804. By 1807 they received additional allowances ranging from £9 2s to £45 10s. The 1812 Establishment raised their emoluments to £85 per annum. Finally, that of 1830 provided for three established helpers at £90 each, eight other helpers at £85 and a single helper at £75.1

The chariot driver was probably appointed by the master of the horse. This officer was allowed £18 5s and a hackney livery.¹

Chairmen [Groom Littermen] 1660-1812

Chairmen (also known as groom littermen) were appointed by the master of the horse. The Household Establishment of 1664 lists two chairmen ('littermen') at 22d per diem (£33 9s 3d) and five such officers at 20d per diem (£30 8s 4d per annum). That of 1674 lists six chairmen or littermen at the latter wage and five littermen (their places to determine) at 12d per diem or £18 5s per annum. By the Establishment of 1679, these numbers had become eight chairmen at £30 8s 4d and three such officers at £18 5s per annum. In addition, chairmen were allowed one hackney livery on the Stables Establishment of 1669, a suit of livery worth £36 and bread, beer and beef when in attendance. James II reduced the number of chairmen to four at £36 per annum, which wages were raised to £42 per annum by Queen Anne by the provision of an allowance of £6 for livery. The position was abolished by the Establishment of 6 April 1812.

Grooms 1660-1837

Grooms of the Stables were appointed by the master of the horse. Grooms were distinguished as being of the coursers' (also known as the crown or great horse) stable or the hunting and padd stable under Charles II and again under William III. The Household Establishment of 1664 lists two grooms of the coursers' stable at 10d per diem (£15 4s 2d per annum), twenty-eight such officers at 14d per diem (£21 5s 10d per annum), and thirteen grooms of the hunting stable at 12d per diem (£18 5s per annum). In addition, nine groom sumptermen at 12d per diem (£18 5s per annum) and two grooms of the hales at £9 2s 6d per annum were appointed under Charles II. By 1667 there were 13 grooms of the hobby stable. These appear to have been transferred to the Queen's establishment by 1669, but late in the reign, seven grooms of the hobby stable were appointed on the King's establishment at £18 5s per annum and hunting grooms were raised to £30. James II reduced the number of grooms to 21 at £54 per annum, plus a hunting groom at £18 5s. William III and Mary II raised their number to a total of 31, and allowed them a suit of livery worth £36. Anne reduced their number and wages to ten at £36 per annum on the Establishment of 1702. She appointed an additional hunting groom in 1708 and two more in 1710 at £36 plus £10 per annum in lieu of lodgings in London and other necessaries. George I allowed twenty-four grooms at £54 per annum plus one groom of the coursers' stable at £63 per annum. George II began with 25 grooms (afterwards reduced to 20) at £60 and two grooms at £120 per annum. One groom was assigned to the hobby stable from 1754.²

In 1761 the position of first groom, 'which had been extinct for many years' was revived for William Cates at £10 per annum. George III began with eighteen grooms at £60 per annum. This rose to 30 grooms at £70 per annum by 1782. In 1783 there were eighteen grooms, including a first groom at £70, the remainder at £60 per annum. By 1807, the grooms were allowed additional emoluments ranging from £21 1s to £73 3s. In 1812 there were sixteen grooms ranging in salary from £95 to £200. In 1823 their number rose to seventeen.³

Bottlegrooms c. 1667-1782

There were two bottlegrooms (also known as 'Grooms of the Bottle Horses') on the Household Establishment of 1664. They each received £24 6s 10d per annum. Later in the reign of Charles II they each received £18 5s. Their number was reduced to one on the Establishment of 1685, at £54 per annum in wages. This servant's wages were reduced to £36 per annum under Queen Anne, but were raised to £82 on the Establishment of George II in order to pay for two horses. Prior to abolition in 1782 as a sinecure, this servant received £82 in salary and £36 per annum for livery.¹

Messenger of the Avery (or Stables) c. 1682-1837

The messenger of the avery (or messenger of the stables) was appointed by the master of the horse. This office first appears on the Stables Establishment of 1682, which lists remuneration

of one nagg's livery in money. The messenger was awarded £15 per annum beginning with the Establishment of 1685. This was raised to £27 per annum in 1768 ('on a petition, shewing that the Salary was too small to live on, as constant attendance was required'), lowered to £25 in 1783, raised to £57 per annum in 1812 and £90 in 1830. By 1807 he was entitled to an additional allowance of £20 per annum.¹

Porters of the Stables [?1660]-1837

Porters of the stables were probably appointed by the master of the horse. One appears to have been established around 1660. The porter of the Great Mews first appears on the Establishment of 1685 at £18 per annum. The porter at the Upper Gate Mews, established in 1761 made £25 per annum. By 1807, the porter at the Upper Gate was allowed an additional £9 2s, that at the Lower Gate £66 16s. By 1812 the remuneration ranged for seven porters at various locations from £57 to £105 per annum. By 1820 there was an upper porter at Carlton House at £105, eight other porters at £95 apiece and 2 (at the King's Mews) at £57 apiece. In 1828 a porter was added at Hampton Court. By 1830 porters of the stables were entitled to additional allowances ranging from £9 10s to £42 per annum. In 1830-31 two more porters were added to the second salary rank.¹

First listed under George II at £20 per annum, the emoluments for this position were raised to £26 (including a £6 allowance for coals) under George III. An additional allowance of £35 2s was granted by 1807. By 1830 this servant made £30 per annum with an additional allowance of £37 for an apartment and fuel. John Carter's duties were carried out by Edward Ludd.¹

The Stud 1661-1830

In 1661 the office of master of the stud was granted by the Crown by letters patent under the great seal. Subsequent appointments were made by warrant of the master of the horse. The wages were fixed at £26 in 1682. By 1689 a salary of £200 was provided. The office was left vacant between 1702 and 1708 and discontinued following the death of Richard Marshall in 1728, after which the stud was placed under the direct management of the master of the horse. ¹

The stud keeper was appointed by warrant of the master of the horse. He was established in 1760 at £40 per annum. By 1807 this had risen to £94 4s plus an allowance of £43 17s 3d. This office was abolished by the Establishment of 5 July 1823.²

The marshal farrier of the stud was appointed by the master of the horse. This office was established in 1708, and was paid £60 per annum (as sergeant and marshal farrier to the stud) on the Establishment of 1714. The office was abolished on 1 Oct. 1715.³ The stud farrier was appointed by warrant of the master of the horse. He received £20 per annum on the Establishment of 29 Nov. 1760. This salary was abolished in 1782 when this place became a purveyorship.⁴

The groomships of the stud were in the gift of the master of the horse. Two such offices were established in 1708 and were paid £36 per annum on the Establishment of 1714. They are not noticed in Household documents thereafter until the reign of George II, when they were given an additional allowance of £18 4s for the keeping of a horse. A third such servant was added to take care of colts at Windsor Lodge in 1767. By 1807 they made salaries of £54 4s, plus the additional allowance noted above. In 1812 the head stud groom made £115, the two other such grooms £95 per annum. This subdepartment was abolished on the Establishment of 1830.⁵

The helpers to the stud (or stud helpers) were appointed by warrant of the master of the horse. The Establishment of 1714 lists four such servants, providing no names. In 1760 the four stud helpers receiving £30 per annum apiece. Their number was reduced to three in 1771, then raised to four again in 1804. By 1807 they were entitled to additional allowances worth between £13 and £44 1s 6d. The position was eliminated on the Establishment of 6 Apr. 1812.⁶

The gate porter to the stud was established at £18 per annum in 1823.⁷

Keeper of the Racehorses 1693-1782

The office of keeper of the racehorses or running horses at Newmarket, to which appointments were made by the Crown, was created in 1693 with an allowance of £1,000 for the maintenance of ten horses and necessaries. The allowance was reduced to £600 (for six horses) in 1702,

restored to its former level in 1709 but reduced again to £600 in 1728. The office was abolished in 1782.

A groom of the running horses occurs c. 1743 at £63 per annum for four stud helpers.

Yeomen Prickers c. 1783-1814

The Establishment of 1 Jan. 1783 provides for six yeomen prickers at £104 apiece; that of 1812 raised this to £129 apiece. By 1807, they also received allowances ranging between £25 and £35 10s. The royal warrant of 29 Mar. 1814 lists six yeomen prickers who, 'through Age or Infirmities [are] incapable of executing the Duties of their Offices' and so were reduced to compensations.¹
