

**Household of Prince William Henry, Duke of Gloucester 1751-1805
(incorporating officers also serving Prince Henry to 1765)**

Prince William's servants were originally paid on the establishment of Augusta, Dowager Princess of Wales. He received his own establishment circa 1760, though many servants were shared with Prince Henry until 1765. He was allotted £29,000 for the support of his household.¹

By the establishment of Michaelmas 1751 the two pages of the backstairs to Prince William and Prince Henry made £70 per annum apiece (£40 in salary and £30 in boardwages).¹
